Minutes of a Meeting of Donington with Boscobel Parish Council held on Tuesday 16th July 2024 at the Methodist Church Hall, Albrighton at 7pm

31.24 Welcome by the Chair

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting

32.24 Apologies for absence and reasons:

There were no apologies for absence.

33.24 Declarations of Interest: a) Pecuniary b) Personal

None were declared

34.24 Public Session:

Shropshire Councillor Nigel Lumby thanked Parish Councillors who had participated in the Boundary Review Working Party, ensuring an continued representation from the Parishes when the new council is formed next May. The ward composition will be 6 from West Albrighton, 5 from East Albrighton, and 4 from Donington and Boscobel. It was noted that West Albrighton will include the Woodlands estate that is currently in Donington Parish. The proposal will be going in front of Shropshire Council for approval on 18th July, it will then require Royal Assent.

The Chairman, Cllr David Williams, said that there were a lot of questions to be answered and that concerns remained, for example, the new Boningdale Development and the impact on the numerical balance of ward composition and representation that the whole exercise was meant to address. He suggested that a cross-council working party could look at the implementation and questions about it.

35.24 Minutes:

The Chairman noted the sad news that former Parish Councillor Hugh Kirton had passed away a few days prior to the meeting. He paid tribute to the work done by Mr Kirton for the Parish Council and for his leadership.

It was resolved to confirm the minutes of the Council meeting held on Tuesday 18th June 2024

36.24 Matters Arising

a) Proposal for works to the Nature Reserve

A presentation was given by representative of the Shropshire Wildlife Trust explaining the proposal for wetland scrapes in the Nature Reserve. It was explained that this is one of several projects in the county, and that the proposals were looking the whole river catchment. It was stressed that nothing proposed would stop the flow of water, however, anything that is done to reduce flooding will be a positive. It was also noted that houses had been built on the floodplain in the 1960s.

The proposed works will create multiple channels and a wetland system that will create a refuge for water voles against mink. Mink are invasive and it is believed that they are present in this catchment. The proposals will have a positive impact on wildlife, including birds and insects.

Weir reduction would solve the problem but this is a complicated feat of engineering, so this alternative scheme will help alleviate the flow.

There was some discussion on the presentation and the written paper from Shropshire Council's Parks and Countryside Manager presenting the proposals. It was noted that whilst it would not alleviate all problems, even a negligible effect would be a positive. It was also noted that the Wildlife Trust had approximately £2K to spend on the project, and that if the Parish Council covered the whole £10,250 cost the Wildlife Trust would have money freed up to spend on works further upstream. This work would still be within the Parish.

It was resolved to supports the works proposed by the Wildlife Trust and Shropshire Council

It was resolved to fund the works at the full cost of £10.250

b) Standing Orders

It was resolved to approve the Standing Orders

c) Swimming Club Grant

It was resolved to confirm the Swimming Club grant of £2,000 as agreed at the meeting of 18th June

d) Nature Reserve Legacy Project:

There was discussion on the proposals for the Nature Reserve Legacy Project as presented by the Nature Reserve Management Committee in a written paper circulated prior to the meeting. It represents five years' worth of projects with an overall cost of £26,342. The projects include:

- Plants approximately £500
- Interpretation board approximately £2,342
- Upgrading existing and new paths £12,200
- New edges to all path £7,300
- Replacement bridges approximately £4,000

Cllr Lee Chatburn expressed the view that monies should be committed before the winter or the projects will not happen. It was noted that with the impending amalgamation of Councils, both sets of reserves will no longer exist and that this was an opportunity to invest in the Nature Reserve with public money kept for this purpose.

Cllr David Williams welcomed the initiative to create easy access for everybody. Cllr Robert Parry expressed concern about digging up top soil in the meadow.

Cllr Robert Parry left the meeting

It was resolved to fund the Nature Reserve Legacy Project to the cost of £26,342

36.24 New Business

a) St Mary's Church Centre grant request

St Mary's Church Centre has provided a grant form and associated paperwork costing a plan to upgrade their kitchen facilities. The project aims to install a semi-commercial fitted kitchen for the use of the community and volunteer groups including the Men's Breakfast, St Mary's Tearoom and Cosy Café.

Councillors discussed the merit of the project to the community, and noted that the Church Centre supports a lot of groups. Cllr Lee Chatburn said that the costs for an commerical kitchen seemed good.

It was resolved to offer £10,000 towards the project
